- 1. Functionalists
 - Things are dependent on their causes.
- 2. Independents
 - All things exist dependent on their parts.
- 3. Consequence School
 - All things exist dependent on you calling them and thinking of them as you do.

- 1. Functionalists
 - the self that has no causes
- 2. Independents
 - the self that exists independent of its parts
- 3. Consequence or Implication School
 - the self that exists independent of my thinking about it or naming it
